Not a Knockout

How may we continue to live our lives full of peace, even in the midst of a pandemic?

Throughout this stay-home duration, I have been applying one lesson I learnt when I was a younger Christian. In fact, it is one of Sister Christina's constant teachings - when it is boring, you make it interesting! Another relevant takeaway that comes to mind is one I heard while driving a missionary back home after he had visited us. I had asked him how he managed to support himself and his work. He then shared a story from one of the classes he taught about mission work. During that class, he told everyone who came that he had a company which provided for his every mission endeavour and all his personal needs. "They are looking for people to franchise," he said, "Is anyone interested?" Everybody raised their hands. Then the missionary replied, "Take out your paper and pencils, and copy this website... www.fasting&prayer.com". The class went silent for a while, before everyone burst out in laughter.

I also looked at the missionary and laughed. I told him, "You are funny!" This missionary is none other than Rev. Irvin E. Rutherford. His story remains relevant to our current circumstances today. In situations like this, I have learnt to be still and pray.

There is also much we can learn from people of the past whose attitudes can help inform the way we approach the things happening in our world right now. Those people had to respond to challenges very similar to COVID-19. Pastor Edmund Chua, one of our directors, shared such an example with us from Martin Luther. When Martin Luther was dealing with The Black Death plague, he wrote these wise words:

"I shall ask God mercifully to protect us. Then I shall fumigate, help purify the air, administer medicine and take it. I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order not to become contaminated and thus perchance inflict and pollute others and so cause their death as a result of my negligence. If God should wish to take me, he will surely find me and I have done what he has expected of me and so I am not responsible for either my own death or the death of others. If my neighbour needs me however I shall not avoid place or person but will go freely as stated above. See this is such a God-fearing faith

because it is neither brash nor foolhardy and does not tempt God." (Taken from Luther's Works, Volume 43, Page 132, the letter "Whether one may flee from a Deadly Plague" written to Rev. Dr. John Hess)

Lord, set us free from panic. Let Your peace rule our hearts and minds; and as we surrender and submit in worship, may we be found doing Your will, in Your Victory, in this troubled world. Amen.
